What you will learn:

- HUD Form 9834 is used to document the Management and Occupancy Review. MORS will take you from the desk reviews of the HUD staff and contract administrator before they arrive on-site, to making corrections or challenging findings after the MOR has been completed.
- Learn what is behind each item on the HUD Form 9834. MORS uses material from Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations; HUD Handbook 4350.3, Rev. 1; along with a variety of HUD notices.
- MORS will teach you to spot and correct potential trouble spots in advance of the review. While NCHM cannot guarantee you'll receive a superior rating on the MOR, we can assure you that you'll have a greater understanding of the process, guidelines, and regulations and the potential pitfalls. Until you gain this knowledge, it will be a daunting challenge to spot the warning signs and take the right action.


